The Trussell Trust Foodbank Network was founded in 2004 after four years of developing the original foodbank based in Salisbury. Since then The Trussell Trust has helped communities work together to launch foodbanks nationwide in a wide range of towns and cities. The organisation thinks that that nobody in our local community should have to face going hungry. So that's why it provides three days' nutritionally balanced emergency food and support to local people who are referred to them in a time of crisis.
